What is Title IX?

Title IX is a federal law that prevents sex discrimination at educational institutions. Title IX is not just about sports; it is a prohibition against all sex-based discrimination. Title IX mandates that schools must be proactive in ensuring that their campuses are free of sex discrimination and have procedures in place to address complaints of sexual discrimination, harassment, or violence.

How does Title IX apply to BYU-Hawaii?

BYU-Hawaii is dedicated to creating a campus community that is safe and respectful. BYU-Hawaii is committed to protecting students, faculty, staff, and visitors from any form of sex discrimination, sexual harassment, misconduct, or violence. Students, faculty, staff, administrative employees, or others participating in BYUH's education programs and activities may report unlawful sex discrimination or sexual misconduct to the Title IX Coordinator.

Does Title IX only apply to discrimination against women?

Title IX equally protects the rights of both women and men. Title IX requires that women and men receive fair and equitable treatment in all areas of education, as well addresses cases of sexual violence/assault, dating violence, domestic violence, stalking, or harassment

How can I file a Title IX complaint?

Any faculty, staff, or student who believes that Title IX has been violated should discuss his or her concerns or file a complaint with BYUH's Title IX Coordinator. Complaints may be made in person, in writing, online, or over the phone.
